

§ 1 GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. The regulations below – hereinafter referred to as ‘Regulations’ are published by the organiser and concerns a mass events of an artistic and entertainment nature called "Main Concert - Juwenalia UEK 2020" – carried out in the form of a concert under mass events category as stated in article 3 of the Act of 20 march 2009 on the safety of mass events (Journal of Laws 2015, item 2139) hereinafter referred to as ‘the Party’ and is organised on the territory of the Republic of Poland, in accordance with the Polish law – including the Civil Code.
2. The organiser of the event is The Student Parliament Association of the University of Economics in Cracow hereinafter ‘the organiser’.
3. The party will take place on campus of the University of Economics in Cracow (address: Rakowicka 27, 31-510 Cracow)
4. Admission and attendance on the premises and during the party are covered by a fee, based on valid and compulsory tickets, invitations and accreditations.
5. Every person staying on the premises and during the duration of the party is obliged to comply with the provisions of these regulations.
6. The organiser through its representatives and subordinate services has the right to refuse entry to the party premises, any persons who are intoxicated, indicating sign of alcohol consumption or under the influence of drugs and other intoxicants, or the removal of such persons from the party premises in the events of such circumstances.
7. The organiser does not take any responsibility for items and personal belongings left on the party premises.
8. The purpose of the regulations is to ensure safety and security through specifying the rules of admission, participation in the party, the rules of conduct of persons present at the party and the usage of the premises at which the party is set alongside all devices located on it, as well as regulation the rights and obligations of participants in connection with the purchase of an admission ticket to the party.
9. The terms below used in the regulations shall have the following meanings:
 - a. ‘Ticket’ refers to an individual right to enter the party, which is verified before entering the party premises, either in paper form (tickets bought stationary), or in the form of a code (tickets bought online).
 - b. ‘Premises’ refers to the designated part of campus of the University of Economics in Cracow, in which the party will take place.

- c. 'Participants' refers to a person participating in the party based on a purchased ticket.
- d. 'Order services' and 'Information services' refers to persons appointed by the organiser, including persons and equipment from protection agencies, to care for the safety of persons participating in the event, including the authorizing of participants to enter the party premises.

§ 2

TICKET SALES

1. Tickets are sold only in authorised sales points, and via the online ticket website.
2. The organiser informs, that according to article 133 of the Act of Mat 20, 1971, the Code of Offenses: "Whoever acquires tickets for artistic, entertainments or sporting events for profit sales, or who sells such tickets at a profit, is subject to the penalty of detention, imprisonment or fine. Attempt and aiding are punishable."
3. The organiser warns that purchasing tickets from uncertified sources can risk the purchase of counterfeit tickets, which can lead to rejection of the ticket and entrance onto the party premises.
4. In the event that a participant with a disability needs a supporting person, then admission to the party for a person supporting a participant with a disability is included in the price of the entrance ticket for a participant with a disability, and the participant with a disability ticket entitles the supporting person to enter the party premises and accompany the participant with a disability. This entitlement applies only to persons supporting people with a significant degree of disability including wheelchair users with any degree of disability. The degree of disability referred to as above should be confirmed by a decision of the Proviant Disability Adjudication Group (together with a photo document confirming identity) or a valid ID of the disabled persons (together with a photo document confirming identity).
5. A purchased ticket is not refundable or not exchangeable. The organiser is not obliged to compensate the ticket/subscription holder except for the refund of sum of the ticket in the event of a cancelled party. The return is made on the basis of presenting a proof of ticket purchase.

§ 3 ENTERING THE PREMISES

1. 1. Admission to the party premises is for individuals over the age of 18 who have a valid ticket, along with a valid student ID or ID card, depending on the ticket type.
2. In the case of lack of documents allowing a discounted price, a surcharge can be paid.
3. When leaving the party premises, the ticket will no longer be valid.
4. It is forbidden to enter the party premises with:
 - a. Drinks (including alcohol) and food
 - b. Firearms and dangerous items, these include: explosives, pyrotechnics, corrosive substances, intoxicants and psychotropic substances as well as any objects that may pose a threat to other participants.
 - c. Video recording devices (cameras and drones)
 - d. Animals are forbidden
 - e. Baggage bigger than cabin size (42 x 32 x 25 cm)
5. Order services are allowed to search entering participants, in order to prevent prohibited items listed in point 4 from being brought onto the party premises. In case of suspicion that entering participants are or are in possession of prohibited items specified in point 4, order services will be called, and participants will leave the mass event.
6. The qualification of objects as dangerous is settled by the organiser and subordinate services.
7. Participants who do not meet the requirements established in point 1, as well as being under the influence of alcohol, intoxicants, behaving aggressively possessing prohibited items specified in point 4 of these regulations, refusing to submit clothing and luggage for inspection will lead to a ban on admission to mass events. In such cases, these persons will be asked to leave the premises by order services.

§ 4 ORGANISATIONAL AND REGULATORY RULES APPLICABLE TO THE PARTY

1. The organiser provides security and safety to persons that are present at the party and order during the party through:
 - a. Order services and Information services;
 - b. The appointment of a security coordinator to manage the order services and the organisation of this service.
 - c. Providing access to hygiene and sanitary facilities and providing medical assistance
2. The organiser provides fire safety through:
 - a. Service staff, order and information services and the organiser must be familiar with the location of hand-held fire-fighting equipment and hydrants, in addition to knowing how to deal in case of a fire:
 - b. Order and information services must be trained in the scope of principles of evacuation, how to alert the fire brigade, rules and regulations for the use of hand-help fire-fighting equipment and providing first aid
3. On the party premises it is forbidden to:
 - a. Record any professional audio-visuals, including by means of unmanned aerial vehicles, artistic performances taking place (does not include persons with appropriate accreditation issued by the organiser).
 - b. Conduct any commercial, advertising, donation collecting activities without the correct accreditation issued by the organiser.
 - c. Enter or pass through buildings and equipment not intended for general use (e.g. fences, walls, trees, masts, posts and roofs).
 - d. Enter areas which are forbidden for participants (e.g. backstage, indoor areas, staff rooms).
 - e. Deal with physiological needs outside of toilets
 - f. Litter the party premises
4. Participants staying at the party premises are obliged to follow the instructions of the organiser and order services, which are caring for the safety and security.
5. Order service may apply direct measures, subject to the principles set in provisions on the protection of persons and property, as well as in the provisions regarding the conditions and manner of use of direct measures by security personnel.
6. The party participants and all other persons present on the party premises are obliged to behave in a manner that does not endanger the safety of other persons present at the party and obliged to follow the regulations presented. It is forbidden to destroy equipment in the party premises.

7. Participants destroying property, disturbing the course of the party, posing threat to life or health of other persons will be removed from the party premises by the order service in order to hand over to the police.
8. Order services pursuant to the provisions of the act are entitled to:
 - a. Checking and controlling entitlements to stay on the party premises, and in the event of lack of such authorizations – calls to leave the party premises
 - b. Check ID's of participants in order to determine identity, check contents of luggage and clothing of participants, in case of suspicion that these persons are in possession of items referred to in § 3 point 4.
 - c. Issuing orders to persons disturbing public order or behaving against regulations of the party, and in the event of failure to comply with these order – to call the persons to leave the party premises.
 - d. Use in cases referred to in article 11 point 1 and 2 of the Act of 24th Mat 2013 on coercive measures and firearms (Journal of Laws item 628), coercive measures referred to in article 12 paragraph 1 point letter a and b, point 2 letter a and point 12 letter a of this Act.
 - e. Apprehending persons who pose a direct threat to human life or health, as well as protected property for immediate transmission to the police.
9. The organiser does not take responsibility for any damage, injuries, thefts and material losses resulting from inappropriate actions of other participants.
10. The organiser had provided a deposit payable 10 PLN per item. Only items included in the deposit regulations will be accepted in the deposit.
11. On mass event premises low-percentage up to 3.5% alcohol consumption is allowed, which can be purchased in designated catering zones on the party premises. Purchase and consumption of low-percentage above 3.5 % alcohol is possible only in a closed catering area outside the party premises.
12. The party premises is a no smoking area, apart from designated smoking areas allocated by the organiser.
13. During the party the organiser and participants, and any other persons present at the party premises, are obliged to comply with the provisions of the Act on upbringing in sobriety and counteracting alcoholism.

§ 5 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTY PARTICIPANTS

1. The organiser informs that due to the large number of participants and the necessary control and security measures applied at the entrance to the party premises, participants are required to arrive at the party premises in advance.
2. The organiser informs that participants and any other persons on the party premises will be exposed to loud sounds that may cause hearing damage, and strobe lights.
3. The organiser also records the party for the purpose of documentation, promotion and advertisements of the party in the future years, the organiser and partners. The image of participants and persons present at the party premises may be recorded and used for documentation, reporting, advertisement and promotional purposes. Any participants that do not agree to the publication of their image must submit a written statement to the e-mail address: iga.kaluza@juwenaliauek.pl in accordance with article 81 of the Act of 4th February 1994 on Copyright and Related Rights (i.e. Journal of Laws 1994 number 24 item 84, as amended
4. On the party premises it is forbidden to conduct any advertising, marketing and promotional activity not previously agreed with the organiser. Any persons who violate this ban will be removed from the Party Premises. The organiser will not be obliged to compensate the ticket holder who does not comply with the ban.

FINAL PROVISIONS

1. The following regulations are available on:
 - a. The online website www.juwenaliauek.pl
 - b. At information points on the Party Premises
 - c. At entrances on the Party Premises
2. The organiser has the right to cancel the Party, or to determine and change the course of the Party for justified reasons (illness of the artist, cancellation by the artist, force majeure, etc.) as well as the right to determine and change the course in terms or artistic and time measures.
3. The organiser does not take responsibility for the effects of force majeure. Force majeure is considered to be events beyond the control of the organiser that make the performance of the obligations impossible or that may be classified as impossible due to the circumstances. Force majeure is in particular atmospheric conditions, breakdowns or disruptions in the operating devices supplying electricity, heat, lights, warfare or state/local government activities in the formulation of policies, laws and regulations affecting the performance of obligations.
4. The Party participants are obliged to comply with order from the organiser, police, fire fighters, speaker and the order service.

5. In matters not covered by the regulations, the provisions of the Act on the safety of mass events and Civil Code shall apply.
6. In the event of damage to property used during the Party, the provisions of the regulations of the Minister of Internal Affairs and Administration of 31st July 2009 on the detailed procedure for evaluating damage arising in connection with activities at the place and duration of the mass event and the procedure for applying for compensation shall apply (Journal of Laws of August 3, 2009).
7. The condition of ensuring order and safety of participants and equipment users is to comply and respect the rules contained in these regulations with the provisions of criminal law and offenses law.
8. The organizer, within the scope specified by the Act and executive regulations, is entitled to record the course of the Party, and in particular the behaviour of persons, using video and sound recording devices. Materials collected and recorded during the Party can be used as evidence enabling the initiation of criminal proceedings or proceedings in cases of offences. These materials are immediately forwarded by the organiser to the prosecutor component for the party premises or the police. The materials collected during the recording of the Party, which do not contain evidence enabling initiation criminal proceedings or proceedings in cases of offenses or evidence relevant to such proceedings, are stored after the end of the Party for a period of at least one month, and then are subject to commission destruction.
9. In matters not covered by the regulations and regarding fire safety, the provisions arising from the Fire Protection Act shall apply.
10. The organiser reserves the right to interpret and make possible changes to these regulations.
11. The organiser informs that all items and vehicles located on exit routed or obstructing any rescue operations will be removed at the owner's expense.
12. Participants and persons present on the Party premises may be exposed to constant loud sounds that may cause hearing damage and to flashing lights or some of its natural combinations that may cause loss of consciousness or epileptic attacks.
